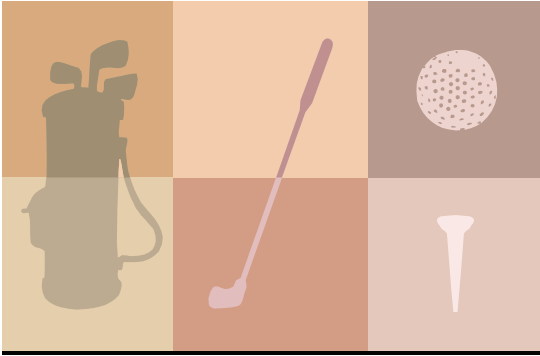

The tournament format is a **4-person scramble**. Registration will open at 7:00 am, with a shotgun start at 9:00 am. Food and prizes will be provided by local sponsors. Silent Auction.

The Highlands Golf Course was designed with environmentally sensitive areas incorporated into the layout taking advantage of wetlands, existing stands of native grasses and trees, and low maintenance turf to provide a prairie links setting.
